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## Romans 8:31-39

- 31 What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who is against us?
- 32 He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him over for us all, how will He not also with Him freely give us all things?
- 33 Who will bring a charge against God's elect? God is the one who justifies;
- <sup>34</sup> who is the one who condemns? Christ Jesus is He who died, yes, rather who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who also intercedes for us.
- 35 Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?
- 36 Just as it is written, "For Your sake we are being put to death all day long; We were considered as sheep to be slaughtered."
- <sup>37</sup> But in all these things we overwhelmingly conquer through Him who loved us.
- 38 For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers,
- 39 nor height, nor depth, nor any other created thing, will be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Romans 8:33

""">33 Who will bring a charge against God's elect? God is the one who justifies;

- 1) "God's elect"
- 2) "It is God who justifies"
  - (1) Man's relationship with God is a legal one.
  - (2) God Himself has made or constructed the Law which governs His relation with man.
  - (3) God is not only the Law Maker and its administrator, He's the Judge.
  - (4) Any charge brought against man must be brought in terms of the Law and nothing else.

### Romans 3:24, 26b

... being justified as a gift, by His grace through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus... that He might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

## 2 Corinthians 5:21

<sup>21</sup> He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

## Romans 10:4

For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes.
